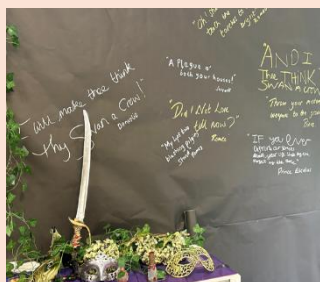


Beech Class
